Robert McMillan served as the chairman of LIHP from its founding until 2001. It was the nation's first suburban coalition of business, banking, labor, religious organizations and academic institutions to build and facilitate the construction of affordable housing. The goal of the organization is to be the catalyst for the development of workforce housing in the region.

After running for the US Senate in 1988, Mr. McMillan was named by President George Bush to the Board of the Panama Canal Commission and in 1993 he was elected Chairman of the Commission's Board of Directors. He is the Director of the US-Panama Business Council and also served as a member of President Ronald Reagan's Commission on Women's Business Ownership. He has been a board member for numerous private and public organizations.

Mr. McMillan co-hosted the PBS current events commentary program "Face-Off" for more than fourteen years. He has frequently provided political commentary for cable television and newspapers and has authored two books. He is currently Of Counsel to the Mineola law firm of Bee Ready Fishbein Hatter & Donovan, LLP.
